

The various historical sights, major businesses, and events in Historic Filipinotown can primarily be found and/or take place along the two main streets of the area: Temple Street and Beverly Boulevard. There are various alternative options to driving when making your way to and around Historic Filipinotown, such as utilizing the Metro bus and LADOT DASH bus transit. In exploring some of the murals or landmarks within the neighborhood parks, be sure to check with the times they are open prior to visiting.

Places to Explore/Sights

- [Gintong Kasaysayan, Gintong Pamana mural](#)



Recognized as the largest Filipino-American mural in the United States. Painted by muralist, Eliseo Art Silva in 1995, Gintong Kasaysayan, Gintong Pamana (“Filipino Americans: A Glorious History, A Golden Legacy”) spans 25 feet tall by 145 feet wide, and depicts notable Filipino and Filipino American figures such as Jose Rizal, Carlos Bulosan, Lapu-Lapu, Larry Itliong, Philip Vera Cruz and more. In the Fall of 2011, Silva, along with numerous youth and collegiate volunteers, worked together to restore the mural at Unidad Park, where it still remains today, open to the public and visible driving west along Beverly Boulevard.

- [Filipino American WWII Veterans Monument](#)



Located at Lake Street Park, this is the first monument dedicated to Filipino soldiers who fought for the United States in World War II. Designed by artist Cheri Gaulke.

- [Remy's on Temple](#)

Art gallery and performance space opened in June 2004, named after Remedios "Remy" Geaga (1916-1997), who fervently dedicated her life to establishing and running several organizations that serve the Filipino community Los Angeles.

Founded in 1985 by Helen Agcaoili Summers Brown ("Auntie Helen"), the Filipino American Library (FAL) is the earliest and largest Filipino library in the country with a collection of more than 6,000 titles.<http://derbydolls.com/>

- [Pilipino Workers' Center](#) (PWC) Jeepney Tours

PWC offers tours (by appointment only) of Historic Filipinotown along their authentic jeepney. PWC also provides services and resources that help meet the immediate needs of Pilipino workers and their families while organizing for long-term change.

- [Historic Filipinotown 5K Run/Walk + Festival](#)

An annual event that features a 5K Run & Walk right through the heart of Historic Filipinotown. Following the race is the HiFi Festival, which features community organizations and business vendors, as well as performances by local and widely known entertainers.
